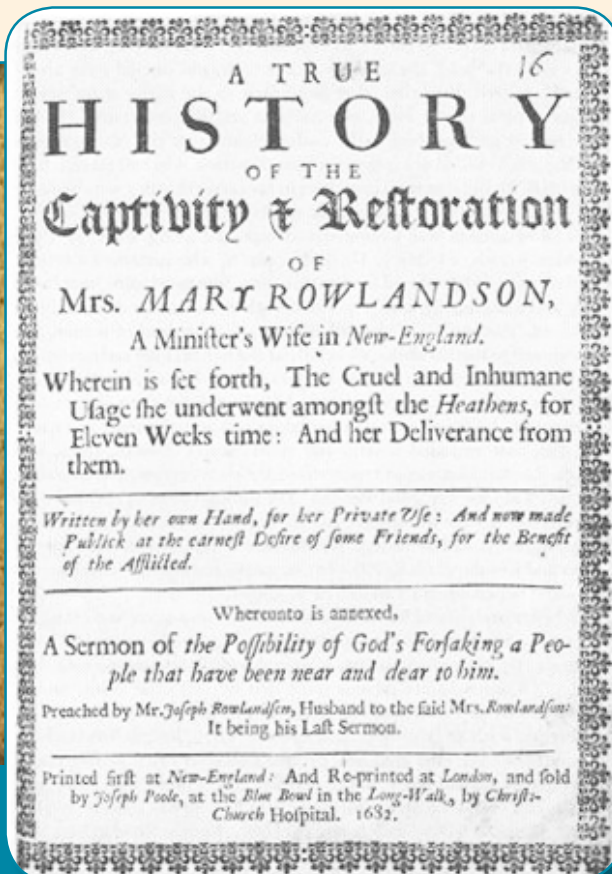

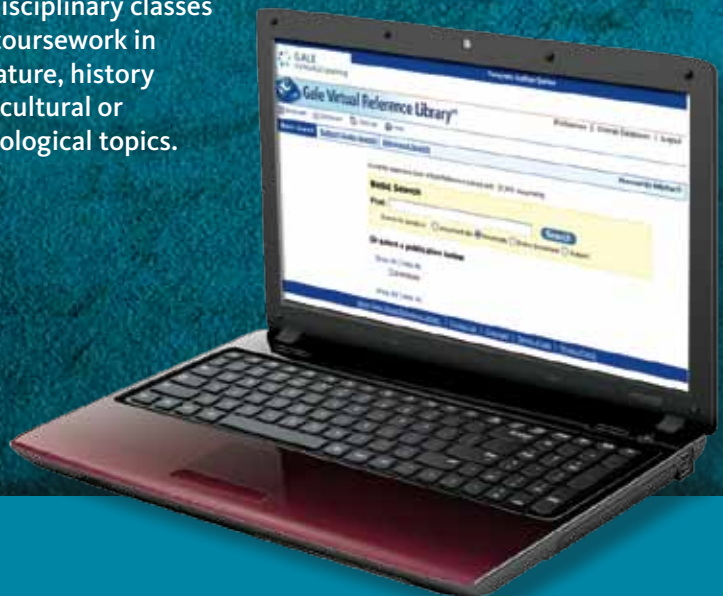

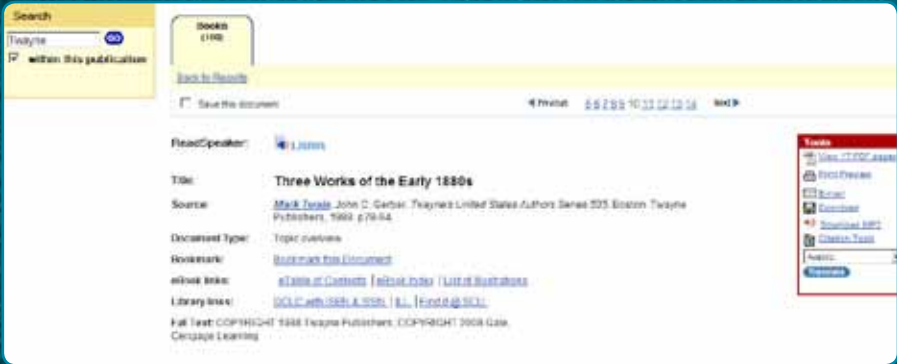

after removing material the next day from the wreck, setting up Crusoe and his possessions in a kind of enclave that miniaturizes what will be his later relation with the island at large: "I barricad'd my self round with the Chests and Boards that I had brought on Shore" (53). As he increases his store from the ship, he changes his nomenclature and expands his domain: "I was gotten home to my little Tent, where I lay with all my Wealth about me very secure" (57).

Digitized pages from the original print volumes add "book-like" appeal for users.
